THE SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT Where Are the Alleluias?

Psalm 130, Mark 2:18-20 Rev. George Fletcher

The season of Lent, that time of preparation for Easter, is not a <u>fun</u> time for the Christian. It would be nice just to skip the suffering and sorrow that Christ experienced. To do away with the self-examination and confession. To not give up favorite foods and activities. Let's not think about the <u>sacrifice</u> that Christ made for each of us and get on to the joy and celebration of the resurrection. It would make this time of year much more enjoyable.

But Christ didn't skip all that preceded Easter Sunday, and neither can we. We <u>need</u> Lent every bit as much as we may dislike it.

Why do we need Lent? Lent keeps us in touch with...

I. The Reality of Life

II. The Certainty of Death

III. The Redemptive Possibility of Suffering

IV. The Constancy of God

O Israel, put your hope in the Lord, for with the Lord is unfailing love and with Him is full redemption. Psalm 130:7 NIV
