THANKFUL FOR.....JESUS Isaiah 52.13-53.12

Isaiah 52-53 paints a picture of a coming time when God will pour out the punishment for our sin on one individual—one who has been rejected by the world and through whom people have been healed. Centuries later, Jesus would fulfill each piece of that prophecy. This passage plainly laid out God's plan for salvation long before Jesus was ever born, yet its ambiguity concealed his plan so well that no one saw it coming. The Messiah was not some fierce warrior come to overthrow the government. He was a humble servant, who would save the world through his suffering. This thanksgiving we are thankful for Jesus.

We are thankful......

• for Christ's example of how to live in this world. See, my servant will act wisely 52.13

To this you were called, because Christ suffered for you, leaving you an example, that you should follow in his steps...When they hurled their insults at him, he did not retaliate; when he suffered, he made no threats. Instead, he entrusted himself to him who judges justly. 1 Peter 2.21, 23

...in your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus... Philippians 2.5

Follow my example, as I follow the example of Christ. 1 Corinthians 11.1

• for Jesus showing us what's really important.

... he will be raised and lifted up and highly exalted. 52.13
