THE FLOUNDERING DISCIPLES Luke 9.37-50

After an awesome experience seeing Jesus transfigured up on the mountain, the disciples come back down to find things not going well. Luke pieces together a picture of the disciples at their worst. But there is good news here!

FOUR KINGDOM TRAITS THAT THE DISCIPLES FAIL TO GRASP:

1. They lack **POWER**.

"I begged your disciples to drive it out, but they could not." v40

2. They lack **UNDERSTANDING** about God's Kingdom.

But they did not understand what this meant. It was hidden from them, so that they did not grasp it, and they were afraid to ask him about it. v45

3. They lack **HUMILITY**.

An argument started among the disciples as to which of them would be the greatest. v46

4. They lack **SYMPATHY**.

"Master," said John, "we saw someone driving out demons in your name and we tried to stop him, because he is not one of us." v49

THERE IS GOOD NEWS HERE. HOW CAN WE AVOID FLOUNDERING AS DISCIPLES OF JESUS?

1. Jesus does not **DISMISS** the disciples but **CONTINUES TO WORK WITH THEM**.

Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and abounding in love, and he relents from sending calamity. Joel 2.13

2. The **WORDS OF JESUS** put us on the right track.

"Listen carefully to what I am about to tell you..." v44

 Jesus reminds us that <u>KINDNESS</u> and <u>COMPASSION</u> to the UNDERSERVED is one of the truest marks of one of his followers.

Then he said to them, "Whoever welcomes this little child in my name welcomes me; and whoever welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me. For it is the one who is least among you all who is the greatest." v48

What is God saying to me?

What am I going to do about it?

Love God, Love Others, Learn Jesus, DO SOMETHING!
